This cover signals the start of a series with a marine theme, typified here by iconic Cape Point. Nowhere else on the coast are there such striking contrasts between the cold, nutrient-rich waters stretching to the west, and the warm, relatively nutrient-deficient south and east coasts. Marine life responds to these contrasts, being highly productive but low in diversity in the Benguela Current, and less productive but more diverse in the Agulhas Current. Furious arguments about precisely where the Indian and Atlantic Oceans meet can never decisively be settled, as the two blend and shift over time; but, biogeographically, Cape Point constitutes the biggest divide on our coastline.
