The mural depicted in the Centenary stamp on the cover is one of three evocative mosaics adorning the old entrance of the library of the Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Cape Town. The mosaic was inspired by one of a series of 'body maps' (artworks originally fashioned on paper) created by women in the Bambanani HIV/AIDS support group in a workshop run by Jane Solomon in Khayelitsha in 2002. The body maps depict the figures and life stories of these women. This one is Nondumiso Hlwele's story about antiretroviral therapy for HIV/AIDS and her fight for – and celebration of – life. Artist and teacher Lovell Friedman was commissioned to recreate the body maps to tell these women's stories of courage in a way that the public could access. She chose to do this in mosaic form and four community artists, Xolani Badli, Sibongile Memani, Mbuyiseli Somdaka and Sandi Mdekazi, carefully crafted these on the library wall.
