Seaslugs, or nudibranchs, are among the sea's most beautiful creatures, their gaudy colours symbolic of their unpalatable nature. One of the most unusual is the sea swallow, *Glaucus atlanticus*, which hangs upside-down at the surface of the sea, buoyed by air that it engulfs and by the long silvery-blue processes that radiate from its body. The sea swallow eats bluebottles; far from being repelled by the fiery stings of the latter, it is able to extract the stinging cells and incorporate them into its own tissues, imparting a second-hand defence.
